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Executive Summary

Overview

This report reflects MIU's ongoing commitment to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs). It highlights the university's contributions during the academic year 2022/2023. The university focused on 11 out of the 17 SDGs and managed to maintain its ranking position within the bracket of 1001–1500 despite the growing pool of participating universities.

Key Achievements

- **Highest Performing SDGs:** The university highest scores were achieved in SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being), SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation) and SDG 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions).
- **Improved SDGs:** Significant improvements were observed in SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being), SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth) and SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production).
- Areas of Decline: MIU scores declined in other SDGs, including SDG 1 (No Poverty), SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 5 (Gender Equality), SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities), SDG 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities), SDG 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions) and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals).





Detailed Performance and Recommendations

- **SDG 1 (No Poverty):** Improved in two out of four metrics, though the total score decreased by 3.3%.

Recommendation: Expand anti-poverty programs to engage a broader community and increase financial aid percentages.

- SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being): Improved in three metrics with a slight overall score increase of 0.3%.

Recommendation: Strengthen collaborations with the Ministry of Health and Population as well as other healthcare organizations.

- **SDG 4 (Quality Education):** Improved in two metrics, but the total score fell by 7.5%.

Recommendation: Enhance literacy and education programs in local communities and improve continuing education offerings.

- **SDG 5 (Gender Equality):** Improved in one metric, with a total score reduction of 9.1%.

Recommendation: Enhance women's mentoring schemes, increase female participation and provide childcare facilities for staff.





- **SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation):** Improved in one metric despite a 12.3% score reduction.

Recommendation: Offer educational programs on water management for local communities.

- **SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth):** Improved in one metric with a 4.5% increase in the total score.

Recommendation: Establish employment unions to enhance employment practices.

- **SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities):** Improved in three metrics despite a 13.1% decrease in the total score.

Recommendation: Increase the number of first-generation students, students from developing countries and those with disabilities.

- **SDG 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities):** Improved in one metric with a 14.5% decline in the total score.

Recommendation: Improve public access to green spaces and libraries, collaborate with local authorities on planning and ensure affordable housing access for residents.

- **SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production):** Improved in two metrics with a 6% increase in the total score.

Recommendation: Enhance the publication of sustainability reports.





- SDG 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions): Improved in one metric though the total score decreased by 3.9%.

Recommendation: Strengthen cooperation with government entities and engage stakeholders more effectively.

- **SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals):** Improved in one metric despite a 33.6% decrease in the total score.

Recommendation: Foster stronger relationships with the government and NGOs, improve sustainability report publications, integrate sustainability courses into educational programs and enhance community education.









General Recommendations for Improvement

To enhance the university's contributions to sustainable development, the following recommendations are proposed:

- **Support Multi-disciplinary Research:** Encourage research initiatives that contribute to multiple SDGs.
- **Documentation:** Ensure all activities are documented and are accessible on the MIU website and that all departments submit annual reports detailing their contributions to the SDGs, including improvement plans and actions.
- **Community Engagement:** Promote initiatives to share university facilities with the local community.
- **Innovation:** Support multidisciplinary research projects and innovations for sustainable solutions.
- Partnership and Cross-Sector Collaborations: Pursue further agreements with local, national and international partners to advance SDG-related initiatives.





- **Annual Sustainability Conference:** Organize an annual sustainability conference showcasing the university's sustainability initiatives, ensuring active participation from both internal and external stakeholders.
- **Achievement of all SDGs:** Develop an action plan with realistic timeframe for achieving all SDGs.

Conclusion

Although the university has made progress in several SDGs, there is a need for strategic enhancements to address areas of decline. Implementing the recommendations can solidify MIU commitment to the SDGs, enhance its impact and improve its future rankings.





Main Report (Performance Analysis)





Misr International University is Recognized by Times Higher Education Impact Rankings for the Fifth Time

MIU has achieved an important milestone, being ranked among the best universities in the world in the Times Higher Education Impact Rankings.

As one of the universities contributing most to the achievement of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, MIU has ranked 1001-1500 among 2152 universities from 125 countries worldwide. In Goal 3, Good Health and Well-being, MIU ranked 401 – 600, in Goal 6, Clean Water and Sanitation, it ranked 401 – 600, in Goal 16, Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions, it ranked 401 – 600 and in Goal 17, Partnerships for the Goals, the university ranked 1001-1500.

This rank highlights the commitment of the University's Faculty, staff and students to actively pursue the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals, thereby enhancing the university's international standing.

In the academic year 2022/2023, MIU demonstrated continued commitment to SDGs, with improvements in certain goals such as SDG 3 (Good Health and Wellbeing), SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth) and SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production). However, scores declined in SDG 5 (Gender Equality), SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities) and SDG 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities).










Results of 2021-2022 Impact Ranking






























































Evaluation of Impact Ranking of MIU 2020/2021 and 2021/2022

Introduction




Figure 1. Number and distribution of Egyptian universities participating in THE Rankings from 2020/2021 to 2021/2022

Misr International University's participation in Times Higher Education Impact Rankings started in 2020. The following report aims at measuring performance of the university in rankings as well as suggesting methods of improvement. Figure (1) represents the number of Egyptian universities and their distribution (Governmental and Private) in the past two years. There is an increase in number of private and national universities' participation while the number of governmental universities hasn't changed.

Evaluation of Impact Ranking of MIU 2020/2021&2021/2022(Cont.):

In 2020/2021, MIU scored 56.5 out of 100 as a total score in THE Rankings and ranked 801-1000 out of 1591 universities while in 2021/2022 it ranked 1001-1500 out of 1963 universities. MIU participated in 11 goals of THE Impact Rankings. The highest scores were achieved in SDG 3, SDG 6 and SDG 16. Analysis of overall goal scores revealed improvement in SDG3, SDG 8 and SDG 12. There was a decline in scores of other goals (Figure 2).




Figure 3. Scores of MIU (Black Dot) in relation to the median scores worldwide

Scores of MIU in different SDGs in relation to the median scores worldwide is presented in Figure (3).

Figure 2. Performance of MIU in different SDGs 2020/2021 to 2021/2022

Assessment of Improvement in Different SDGs




Figure 4. Traffic light model for assessment of improvement in indicators of each goal

Assessment of Improvement in Different SDGs

SDG 1 (No Poverty)

SDG 1 consists of four metrics. In 2021/2022 ranking, the university has improved in two metrics. The total score is reduced by 3.3% from 2020/2021 to 2021/2022. Suggestions for improvement in this goal include modifying the anti-poverty program to include wider community in addition to raising the percentage of financial aid.



SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-Being)

The university has improved in three metrics of SDG 3. The improvement in the total score is 0.3% from 2020/2021 to 2021/2022. Suggestions for improvement in this goal include enhancement of collaborations with Ministry of Health and Population and other healthcare organizations.







SDG 4 (Quality Education)

The university has improved in two metrics of SDG 4. The total score is reduced by 7.5% from 2020/2021 to 2021/2022. Suggestions for improvement in this goal include providing programs to enhance literacy and education in communities and schools in the university's local area and beyond in addition to improving continuing education programs.



SDG 5 (Gender Equality)

The university showed improvement in one metric. It has no first-generation female students. The total score reduced by 9.1%. Suggestions for improvement in this goal include improving women's mentoring schemes and participation of female students in these schemes. Another suggestion is providing childcare facilities for staff.







SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation)

The university showed an improvement in one metric. The total score reduced by 12.3%. Suggestions for improvement in this goal include offering educational opportunities for local communities to learn about good water management.



SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth)

SDG 8 consists of five metrics. The university has improved in one metric in addition to the total score. The improvement in the total score is 4.5% from 2020/2021 to 2021/2022. Suggestions for improvement in this goal include formation of employment unions to improve employment practices.











SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities)

SDG 10 consists of six metrics. The university has improved in three metrics. The total score reduced by 13.1% from 2020/2021 to 2021/2022. Suggestions for improvement in this goal include increasing number of first-generation students, students from developing countries in addition to students and staff with disabilities.



SDG 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities)

SDG 11 consists of four metrics. The university has improved in one metric. The total score reduced by 14.5% from 2020/2021 to 2021/2022. Suggestions for improvement in this goal include improving public access to green spaces and libraries in addition to collaboration with local authorities to address planning issues and ensure that local residents are able to access affordable housing.







SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production)

The goal consists of four metrics. The university has improved in two metrics in addition to the total score. The total score increased by 6% from 2020/2021 to 2021/2022. Suggestions for improvement in this goal include improving sustainability reports' publication.



SDG 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions):

The goal consists of four metrics. The university has improved in one metric. The total score reduced by 3.9% from 2020/2021 to 2021/2022. Suggestions for improvement in this goal include enhancing cooperation with government and engagement of stakeholders.











SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals)

SDG 17 consists of four metrics. The university has improved in one metric. The total score decreased by 33.6% from 2020/2021 to 2021/2022. Suggestions for improvement in this goal include enhancing the relationships with the government and NGOs for participation in projects targeting SDGs, improving sustainability reports' publication, adding specific courses of sustainability in the educational programs in addition to improving education for SDGs in the community.









General Suggestions for Improvement


- Support multi-disciplinary research that contributes to multiple SDGs.
- All activities must be documented on MIU website.
- Departments must submit annual report showing their contribution in SDGs. The report includes improvement plan and actions to improve SDGs.
- The university must share its facilities with the local community to improve stewardship.
- Support innovation for sustainable development solutions.
- Further agreements between the university, local, national and international partners should be conducted.

- 4. Teaching: how far the courses offered by universities are relevant to the specific SDGs.












Geographical Collaboration - Overall



International, national and institutional collaboration by Misr International University in the selected year range.




Publications in Top 10% Journal Percentiles by CiteScore Percentile


Outputs in Top 10% Citation Percentiles summary










Benchmarking the Publication Year and Scholarly Output

MIU Dental Clinics Complex: Free Services for All (September 2022 - December 2023)

The Dental Clinics Complex (DCC) at the Faculty of Oral and Dental Medicine, MIU provides all dental services **free of charge** without discrimination based on gender, socioeconomic status, color, race, nationality or religion. Services include medical examination, checking blood pressure, blood glucose level as well as referral to medical specialists when necessary. The complex applies infection prevention and control measures recommended by the American Dental Association (ADA) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Around 460 patients are treated daily, with all necessary precautionary measures applied.

This report highlights the services provided for different categories of patients through the period September 2022 to August 2023.





1. Distribution of patients according to geographical location, frequency of visits and poverty rates




Figure 1. Patients' distribution according to geographical locations and frequency of visits from September 2022 to August 2023

Although the university is located in the geographical scope of Qalyubia Governorate, it serves patients from all governorates of Egypt. From September 2022 to August 2023, the DCC received a total number of 87,811 patients. The majority of the patients came from Cairo Governorate, followed by Qalyubia, Sharqia, Giza and Dakahlia governorates. The poverty rates in those governorates range from 15.2% to 34%. These figures reflect the university's role in providing free health services to a percentage of the poorest groups in society, regardless of the geographical scope of the university (Figure 1).

2. Non-Egyptian patients including refugees

The DCC offers its services to all nationalities without discrimination. A total of 26 foreign patients were treated from September 2022 to August 2023. This number included refugees from Sudan and Syria.





3. Patients' distribution according to gender




Figure 2. Patients' distribution according to gender from September 2022 to August 2023

The DCC serves patients from both genders without discrimination. The distribution is presented in (Figure 2) with male to female ratio of 1:1.27.

5. Serving medically compromised patients




Figure 4. Patients' medical condition from September 2022 to August 2023

The DCC applies Access to Care Policy which guarantees that every new patient is examined by professional medical teams on their first visit. Recurring patients are checked regularly, and medical examination records are documented for them. There is a Code Blue team for dealing with any emergencies. Medical conditions of new patients from September 2022 to August 2023 are presented in (Figure 4). It is worth noting that hypertension was the most common medical condition.
